WHAT IS DENIM DAY?

In Italy in 1992, an 18-year-old girl was raped by her 45-year-old driving instructor. The rape conviction went to the Supreme Court but was overturned. The court cited that her jeans were too tight, and that she must have helped the perpetrator remove her jeans thus constituting it as consensual.

On average, Native American and Alaska Natives, ages 12 and older experience 5,900 sexual assaults per year.

- Native Americans are twice as likely to experience a rape/sexual assault compared to all other races.
- 41% of sexual assaults against Native American are committed by a stranger, 34% by an acquaintance, and 25% by an intimate partner or family member.
